Natchez Sunday 8th 1864 [May ?] My own dear baby

I got your long

and loving letter just after my last raid into La where I had been after the rebs with a sharp stick. I caned the Fort Pillow on them and taught them a lesson which they will long remember. You will see full accounts of it in the papers write to ma should you not be in St. Louis for a copy Of Course the old Lady will keep a copy of that which relates to her darling son And So my darling you gave Binni a good lecture on spending money playing poker & while I don=t know but I deserve it. I know I have been right bad and ought not to have done as I did. I will not play any more for money for six month to come by way of attonement[sic]. I am living economically and will be able to send home a good portion of my income. I expect to be paid off in a few days. I am so sorry for my poor little boy dear little soul How I long to see him and [and] take him to my heart Daisy Dimps Kiss her for me a F____ & teach him to call his papa. My own dear baby How my heart yearns after you all and believe me my own darling child that could I get out of the army now I should do so never mind I will not remain longer than next spring at any rate then I will go home and you will have me all to your self once more I have been to dinner at Judge Harts. I have got such nice quarters and should you come down next fall we will have a nice house to live in I think the lady who occupys a part of it will vacate altogether The weather is delightfully cool. I know you would

be delighted were you down here now Just your kind of days. And so you think I will only write once a week Well old Lady you are very much mistaken then you shall have at least two a week from your old man. Tell Annie to write me I hope she has not forgotten that brother dear entirely. Tell her I am negligent about writing but my heart is all right Browner[?] is in superb condition and will come home one of these days to bear his "Old Mrs" as in days gone by Frank is still with me and often talks of you try and enjoy yourself this summer I will try and do all the saving down here I don't want to see you stinted in any thing here after that is reasonable and within our means. I'll send you the enclosed and will write soon
